In this moment, remind yourself:

- There is a battle going on right now over your life. Capture that which has hindered you. Run with perseverance the race that has been set out for you!
- Jesus is the founder of your life wrought with purpose, meaning and gifts. And He is your model. It wasn't easy for Jesus, and it won't be easy for you. But rest assured, God is present to you and has everything you need to succeed.
- Growing weary is one of the greatest obstacles in life. This is a time for renewal and
 refreshment. Ask God to use these exercise to stir your passion, to give you clarity, and
 infuse wisdom into your decision making as you approach the new year..

This booklet will lead you to first look backwards - remembering 2023 - and then direct you to ask God what he has for you next. God, be with us. And we are cheering for you!


It would be tempting to look at this exercise as new years resolution or goal setting—two things you may have done before. And worse, if you proceeded to complete it with that mindset, you could go on your way and do a whole bunch of things and miss the ONE thing that is needed - an authentic and deep relationship with God.

In the story of Martha and Mary, Jesus reveals the one thing that is more important than any other thing we can ever do- spend time with the giver of life - God. He is the bread of life (John 6:35), living water (John 4:14). He is the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6). Remaining in Him, like a branch connected to the vine, is where we find life and life abundantly (John 15:4, John 10:10).

BIG THEMES

Working with God

I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. John 15:15

It is also a common misinterpretation that we work FOR God as though God is some cosmic bossman who gave us an assignment that He wants us to figure out and will be sorely disappointed when we don't. Jesus' words to His disciples, spoken when He was preparing them for His departure from Earth, sound very different than this notion. Jesus' words are invitational. God is pleased to have us share in the family business and work alongside Him empowered by Him.

How would you think about 2024 if you knew that God wanted to work alongside you rather than you working to prove something to him? He likes you and wants to share in the joys, burdens, and vision you have for your life! This is the foundation for finding TRUE NORTH in our lives.

CHOOSING A WORD OF THE YEAR

Jesus came to bring us healing (Matthew 13:15) and life that is truly life (John 10:10). He wants to grow us, change us, and redeem us. Sometimes that happens suddenly, sometimes that happens slowly over time. Finding a word of the year is partnering with God in the process, seeking to align our will with His will for what He wants to do in us. Choosing a word of the year is all about listening for what God has for us.

How would you answer that question?


remembering why

As I listen now, what am I hearing? If you are not sure, write a few words that resonate with you and go and look them up in the dictionary. Get creative, this word is just for you.







Our minds matter. Our thoughts drive our feelings and are the way we are conscious of things. What comes to mind when you hear the word abundance? What comes to mind when you hear the word scarcity? If your first thought was about money, you are not alone. But what about our mindsets? God desires us to live life from a place of abundance, but more often than we'd like to admit, we tend to operate from a scarcity mindset.

Scarcity is defined as the quality of being scarce or in short supply. This mindset is one of not enough, and it bleeds into the whole of our lives. There's not enough love, recognition, success, grace, mercy, or compassion, forgiveness, not enough (fill in the blank). This type of thinking is a trap.

God wants nothing more than for each of us to prosper. He's placed us on a planet that is nothing short of abundant. But, do you trust that God will take care of you? Do you trust that God will give you everything you need? When we come from a place of fear and distrust, we take our focus away from God and focus on earthly things we believe will secure our future. That's how humans work. When we don't believe God can and will meet our needs, we set out to meet them on our own.

Our minds and hearts were made to know this abundant and generous God. Scripture says, "You are to love the Eternal, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength." If our hearts and minds are too busy and focused on collecting things that corrode and rot, then our hearts are not free to be fully with Him.

The key to living out of abundance is in our perspective. We have to see the abundance, choose to live in it, and, most importantly, give it away! We have to shift our perspective/thinking and trust in God's abundance and believe there is enough. Merriam Webster's definition defines abundance as "overflowing fullness." Living from a space of overflowing fullness will open our minds to new possibilities, new ways of thinking, and new ways of being.
